GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 2022-10

AN ORDINANCE FOR CALENDAR YEAR 2022 TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK
(N.J.S.A 40A:4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of Westfield in the County of Union finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2022 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Town Council hereby determines that a 1.0 % increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$353,286.88 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS the Town Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Town Council of the Town of Westfield, in the County of Union, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2022 budget year, the final appropriations of the Town of Westfield shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5 %, amounting to \$1,236,504.08 and that the CY 2022 municipal budget for the Town of Westfield be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE MAKING OF VARIOUS PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS AND THE ACQUISITION OF NEW ADDITIONAL OR REPLACEMENT EQUIPMENT AND MACHINERY, NEW COMMUNICATION AND SIGNAL SYSTEMS EQUIPMENT AND A NEW AUTOMOTIVE VEHICLE, INCLUDING ORIGINAL APPARATUS AND EQUIPMENT IN, BY AND FOR THE TOWN OF WESTFIELD, IN THE COUNTY OF UNION, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$3,175,000 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council of the Town of Westfield, in the County of Union, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. The Town of Westfield, in the County of Union, State of New Jersey (the "Town") is hereby authorized to make various public improvements and to acquire new additional or replacement equipment and machinery, new communication and signal systems equipment and a new automotive vehicle, including original apparatus and equipment in, by and for said Town, as more particularly described in Section 4 hereof. The cost of the improvements includes all work, materials and appurtenances necessary and suitable therefor.

Section 2. There is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of making the improvements described in Sections 1 and 4 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purposes"), the respective amounts of money hereinafter stated as the appropriation for said respective purposes. Said appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized and the down payment appropriated by this ordinance. It is anticipated that a grant in the amount of \$115,000 from the State of New Jersey Department of Transportation shall be received by the Town to finance the cost of the improvement of Elmer Street described in Section 4.A hereof.

Said grant funds shall be applied as set forth in Section 12 hereof. Said improvements shall be made as general improvements and no part of the cost thereof shall be assessed against property specially benefited.

Section 3. It is hereby determined and stated that the making of such improvements is not a current expense of said Town.

Section 4. The several purposes hereby authorized for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued are set forth in the following "Schedule of Improvements, Purposes and Amounts" which schedule also shows (1) the amount of the appropriation and the estimated cost of each such purpose, and (2) the amount of each sum which is to be provided by the down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance such purposes, and (3) the estimated maximum amount of bonds and notes to be issued for each such purpose, and (4) the period of usefulness of each such purpose, according to its reasonable life, computed from the date of said bonds:

SCHEDULE OF IMPROVEMENTS, PURPOSES AND AMOUNTS

A. Undertaking of the following road improvements: (i) resurfacing of Elmer Street (including curb installation or replacement and drainage improvements, where necessary) and (ii) resurfacing or reconstruction of various roads (including curb installation or replacement and drainage improvements, where necessary), as set forth on a list prepared by the Town Engineer on file or to be placed on file with the Town Clerk, and hereby approved as if set forth herein in full. Depending upon the contract price and other exigent circumstances, and upon approval by the Town Council, there may be additions to or deletions from the list referred to in clause (ii) of the preceding sentence. It is hereby determined and stated that the roads being improved are of "Class B" or equivalent construction as defined in Section 22 of the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law").

Section 5. The cost of such purposes, as hereinbefore stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$85,000 which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purposes, including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law.

Section 6. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$152,000, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said Town, are now available to finance said purposes. The sum of \$152,000 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purposes.

Section 7. To finance said purposes, bonds of said Town of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$3,023,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter

determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 8. To finance said purposes, bond anticipation notes of said Town of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$3,023,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 9. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said bond anticipation notes shall be signed by the Mayor and by a financial officer and shall be under the seal of said Town and attested by the Town Clerk or Deputy Town Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 10. It is hereby determined and declared that the average period of usefulness of said purposes, according to their reasonable lives, taking into consideration the respective amounts of bonds or notes authorized for said purposes, is a period of 11.19 years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 11. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Town Clerk of said Town, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Town, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$3,023,000 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 12. Any funds received from private parties, the County of Union, the State of New Jersey or any of their agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purposes, shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purposes, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purposes shall be reduced accordingly.

Section 13. The Town intends to issue the bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvements described in Sections 1 and 4 of this bond ordinance. If the Town incurs such costs prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes, the Town hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in the maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance.

Section 14. The full faith and credit of the Town are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this

ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the Town, and the Town shall levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Town for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 15. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Town Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 16. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 2022-11

**AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC
BEVERAGE IN CERTAIN AREAS OF THE TOWN OF WESTFIELD**

WHEREAS, on January 18, 2022, P.L.2021, c.395, which allows municipalities to designate outdoor areas upon which people may consume alcoholic beverages, was signed into law and became effective; and

WHEREAS, certain areas of the Central Business District Zone of the Town of Westfield have long been hubs of entertainment and activity, and there are a number of food and beverage establishments in those areas for the public to enjoy; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, it has become apparent that the public health is served by providing opportunities for open air social distancing by permitting patrons of food and beverage establishments to possess open containers of alcoholic beverages in certain areas of the Central Business District as specified herein and, further, that the public desires these opportunities to enhance their enjoyment of our Central Business District; and

WHEREAS, those open container areas would help both visitors to the Town and local residents safely enjoy the open spaces and food and beverage experiences that the Town of Westfield has to offer; and would be consistent with the intent of the new legislation allowing consumers to purchase alcohol for individual consumption; and

WHEREAS, in addition to areas of the Central Business District of the Town, there are other times and areas of the Town in which the open consumption of alcoholic beverages should be formally permitted, such as during Town-sanctioned and permitted block parties, which are hosted by the residents of a block as a group, and special Downtown Westfield Corporation-sponsored events, such as Sweet Sounds Downtown;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

SECTION I. Chapter 24, “Streets and Sidewalks”, shall be and hereby is amended by adding a new article, Article IX, “Open Container Areas” as follows:

Sec. 24-66. Establishment of Open Container Areas.

- A. Pursuant to P.L.2021, c.395, it shall be lawful for any person who is at least 21 years of age to consume open containers of alcoholic beverages outdoors in the following areas:
1. Quimby Street from Central Avenue to Elm Street, but only in those areas that are delineated, designed and/or partitioned for use as outdoor seating or dining areas or for social activities (said areas commonly referred to and

defined herein as “parklets”), or on the sidewalks abutting or immediately adjacent to said areas, as well as on the roadway or portions thereof which have been sufficiently closed to vehicular traffic and reserved exclusively for pedestrian use; and those areas being used as “sidewalk cafés” pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 24, Article VII of the Town Code.

2. East Broad Street from Prospect Street to Elm Street, but only in those areas that are delineated, designed and/or partitioned for use as outdoor seating or dining areas or for social activities (said areas commonly referred to and defined herein as “parklets”), or on the sidewalks abutting or immediately adjacent to said areas, as well as on the roadway or portions thereof which have been sufficiently closed to vehicular traffic and reserved exclusively for pedestrian use; and those areas being used as “sidewalk cafés” pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 24, Article VII of the Town Code.
 3. Elm Street from North Avenue to East Broad Street, but only in those areas that are delineated, designed and/or partitioned for use as outdoor seating or dining areas or for social activities (said areas commonly referred to and defined herein as “parklets”), or on the sidewalks abutting or immediately adjacent to said areas, as well as on the roadway or portions thereof which have been sufficiently closed to vehicular traffic and reserved exclusively for pedestrian use; and those areas being used as “sidewalk cafés” pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 24, Article VII of the Town Code.
 4. That portion of 454 South Avenue West, Block 3101, Lot 1, commonly known as “Foundation Park,” but only during such times when the Town of Westfield or the Downtown Westfield Corporation is sponsoring an event that is open to the public.
 5. That portion of the public sidewalk abutting or immediately adjacent to Central Avenue located at Block 3107, Lots 6, 13, and 14, but only during such times when the Town of Westfield or the Downtown Westfield Corporation is sponsoring an event that is open to the public.
 6. On any street in the Town of Westfield on which a permit has been issued by the Town for the hosting of a residential block party, but only during such times and at such locations as set forth in the approved block party permit, provided that said street has been sufficiently closed to vehicular traffic and no vehicular traffic is permitted to travel upon same during the times of such activity.
- B. A “Parklet” is defined as an area over parking spaces adjacent to a sidewalk area upon which tables, chairs, umbrellas, landscaping, benches, and other accessory components may be placed to create an enhanced pedestrian experience for the general public and patrons of retail businesses, offering an area where one might sit,

rest, recreate, socialize and/or indulge in open air dining and beverage experience. No parklet shall exist within the Town of Westfield without the permission of the Town.

- C. Notwithstanding the provisions of this Ordinance, the sale of alcoholic beverages for consumption in an open container area shall be subject to the provisions of Title 33 of the Revised Statutes of the State of New Jersey, rules and regulations promulgated by the director of the Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control, and all other municipal ordinances.
- D. This Ordinance does not, and is not intended to, confer any greater rights upon a holder of an ABC license or permit than that permitted by the Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control itself, or any law, rule, or regulation regarding alcoholic beverage licenses and permits.

SECTION II. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict or inconsistent with any part of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are in conflict or inconsistent.

SECTION III. If any section, provision, or part of provision of this Ordinance shall be held to be unenforceable or invalid by any court, such holding shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance, or any part thereof, other than the part so held unenforceable or invalid.

SECTION IV. This Ordinance shall take effect after passage and publication in the manner provided by law.

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 2022-12

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF
WESTFIELD, CHAPTER 13, MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC**

BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council of the Town of Westfield in the County of Union as follows:

SECTION I. Chapter 13, “Motor Vehicles and Traffic,” Section 13-4.1 – “Left turn prohibitions.” of the Town Code shall be changed by adding the following language in its entirety:

Name of Street	Location	Hours/Days
Prospect Street	South on Prospect Street to east on East Broad Street	

SECTION II. Chapter 13, “Motor Vehicles and Traffic, Section 13-18 – “Loading and unloading zones.” of the Town Code shall be amended as follows:

§ 13-18 Loading and unloading zones.

The following areas in the central business district (CBD) zone are hereby established as zones for the actively conducting unloading and delivery of materials, merchandise, and supplies to and the removal of the same from properties in the CBD. During the hours of 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., loading zones are to be utilized solely by commercial vehicles which for the purposes of this section of the Town Code are defined as vehicles displaying commercial license plates or a vehicle displaying the name or designation of the vehicle or company owning/operating the vehicle or affixed to the vehicle in visible clear exterior signage or letters. Except for Sundays and federal holidays, during which loading and unloading is prohibited, such persons operating a commercial vehicle may leave standing a vehicle in a designated loading zone only for the time it takes to unload/load materials, but in no event shall such persons load or unload a commercial vehicle for any time longer than 15 consecutive minutes. Subject to all other applicable provisions of this Chapter and state law, parking is permitted in the following loading and unloading zones outside of the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. Additional zones may be created from time to time by ordinance or resolution of the Town Council.

- (a) East side of Elm Street beginning at a point 68 feet south of the southerly curblineline of Quimby Street and extending to a point 60 feet southerly thereof.
- (b) Northeast side of Elm Street northwest of East Broad Street and 10 feet southeast of fire hydrant for a length of approximately 47 feet.
- (c) Northeast side of Prospect Street 35 feet northwest of East Broad Street for a length of approximately 65 feet.
- (d) Southeast side of East Broad Street in front of the premises known as 120-130 East Broad Street for a length of approximately 43 feet.
- (e) Northwest side of Quimby Street, beginning at a point 100 feet northeast of the northeasterly curblineline of Elm Street and extending to a point 45 feet northeasterly therefrom.
- (f) North side of Park Street from 50 feet west of the westerly curblineline of Central Avenue to 100 feet west of the westerly curblineline of Central Avenue.
- (g) East side of Central Avenue, beginning at a point 76 feet southeast from the intersection of East Broad Street and continuing south for a distance of 60.5 feet.
- (h) Northeast side of Prospect Street beginning 10 feet north of the fire hydrant for a length of approximately 55 feet.
- (i) Southeast side of Lenox Avenue, beginning at a point 220 feet northeast of the easterly curblineline of Central Avenue and extending to a point 45 feet northeasterly therefrom.

SECTION III. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict or inconsistent with any part of the terms of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are in such conflict or inconsistent.

SECTION IV. In the event any section, part or provision of this ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid by any court, such holding shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any part thereof other than the part so held unconstitutional or invalid.

SECTION V. This ordinance shall take effect after passage and publication, as soon as, and in the manner permitted by law.
