

Alternatives to Bulk Waste Pick Up

Bring a carload of Bulk Waste or Mattresses to the Westfield Conservation Center:

For a one-time fee of \$40, you can dispose of one carload of bulk waste. You can also dispose of mattresses or box springs for \$25 per item. This program is open to residents of Westfield and does not require a seasonal permit; single-use permits must be purchased online at westfieldnj.gov/conservation.

Recycle your electronics, scrap metal, books and clothing for free at the Westfield Conservation Center: No permit required. A full list of drop-off recycling programs is available at westfieldnj.gov/conservation.

Recycle your electronics or clothing for free with Retrievr. Just text “pickup” to 908-356-4107 and Retrievr will schedule a free home pick-up. Learn more at retrievr.com/location/town-of-westfield-nj.

Help furnish an apartment with Furniture Assist: Donate your gently used furniture, mattresses (except king), toys/games, linens, small appliances, clothes/shoes, books, baby items, kitchen items, lamps, mirrors, rugs and other items that make a house a home. Furniture Assist furnishes 20 apartments per week in the area. Drop-off on Sundays from 12:00 – 2:30PM in Springfield. Learn more at furnitureassist.com.

Donate your household goods to GreenDrop in Springfield. GreenDrop collects clothing and household goods, sells them to local thrift stores, and donates the proceeds to local charities. They accept all new or gently used clothing and shoes, common household items, kitchenware, games/toys, small appliances, electronics, sporting goods, books/CDs/videos and small furniture weighing less than 50 lbs. Either drop-off at their location in Springfield or schedule a home pick-up at gogreendrop.com.

Donate to Goodwill Industries in Springfield NJ. They accept gently used clothing, shoes, jewelry, accessories, handbags, luggage, household goods, books and other items. Visit goodwillnynj.org for more information.

Sell on Westfield NJ Buy/Sell/Trade Facebook page: Just ask to join and post your item on the Facebook page: [facebook.com/groups/WestfieldBST](https://www.facebook.com/groups/WestfieldBST). Keep in mind the old adage – *someone’s junk is someone else’s treasure*.

Contact your private garbage hauler: Most will pick up bulk waste for a small fee.

Use Bagster: Buy this dumpster in a bag and schedule pick-up online with Waste Management. It holds up to a whopping 3,300 lbs of debris in a bag that holds three cubic feet of household items. Buy the \$30 bag at Westfield Home & Lumber or Garwood Home Depot and spend around \$200 for the removal. You can throw out household junk, construction debris, yard waste, dirt/sod/concrete/rocks. But you can’t throw out appliances/tires/large stumps/electronics/food waste/toxic-hazardous items. To learn more, visit thebagster.com.

Have it hauled away by 1-800 Junk: Throw out appliances, mattresses, TVs, printers, computers, bikes, refrigerators, carpeting, furniture, electronics, yard waste, scrap metal, general rubbish, construction waste, and tires. Schedule a quote at 1800junk.com.

Bring your items to the Westfield Free Market. At this event, usually held in the spring, you can drop off most gently used household items that you can carry, which will be available for other residents to bring home, with all remaining items donated to Green Drop. This event is run by the Westfield Green Team.
